EMPOWERING NEIGHBORHOODS

One Omaha staff presented **3** public testimonies to Omaha's City Council supporting the Climate Action Plan, ensuring neighborhood environmental health and well-being concerns are represented at the municipal level.

Through our mini-grant program, we awarded \$5,000 to 5 local groups making positive contributions to their communities. The number of applications for our minigrant increased 500%.

Our team worked 189 hours in promotion and support of the Omaha Community Foundation's neighborhood grants program, helping 48 groups with facilitation services including brainstorming, visioning sessions, budget planning, and technical application assistance.

With our support, **9** groups secured **\$29,825** in funding from the Omaha Community Foundation to increase capacity, expand educational opportunities, and beautify neighborhoods.

FREE FARM SYNDICATE

Since 2020, One Omaha has empowered Free Farm Syndicate through visionary strategic planning, uniting the group and guiding them toward success by connecting them to the tools, spaces, people, funding, and assistance they need to accomplish their goals.

"One Omaha's knowledge was an incredible support as we launched into a new phase with deeper infrastructure to support our mission," says Clare Maakestad of Free Farm.

With our support, Free Farm has received \$15,000 from the Omaha Community Foundation's Neighborhood Grants program and \$10,000 from Mayor Jean Stothert's Neighborhood Grants program, enhancing their capacity and enabling impactful projects. These funds bolstered food production, community

engagement, and sustainable farming methods by allocating resources to plot managers and water providers, fostering community-building with work snacks for volunteers, and acquiring essential items for abundant produce growth. The results were tangible — increased people power, amplified funding, and refined processes, transforming Free Farm into a community beacon.

"We believe that everyone should have access to fresh, locally grown, natural food," Maakestad says. "We could not have done everything we wanted without One Omaha's visioning support!"

- · Gayborhoods, Juneteenth, redlining, and neighborhood advocacy




